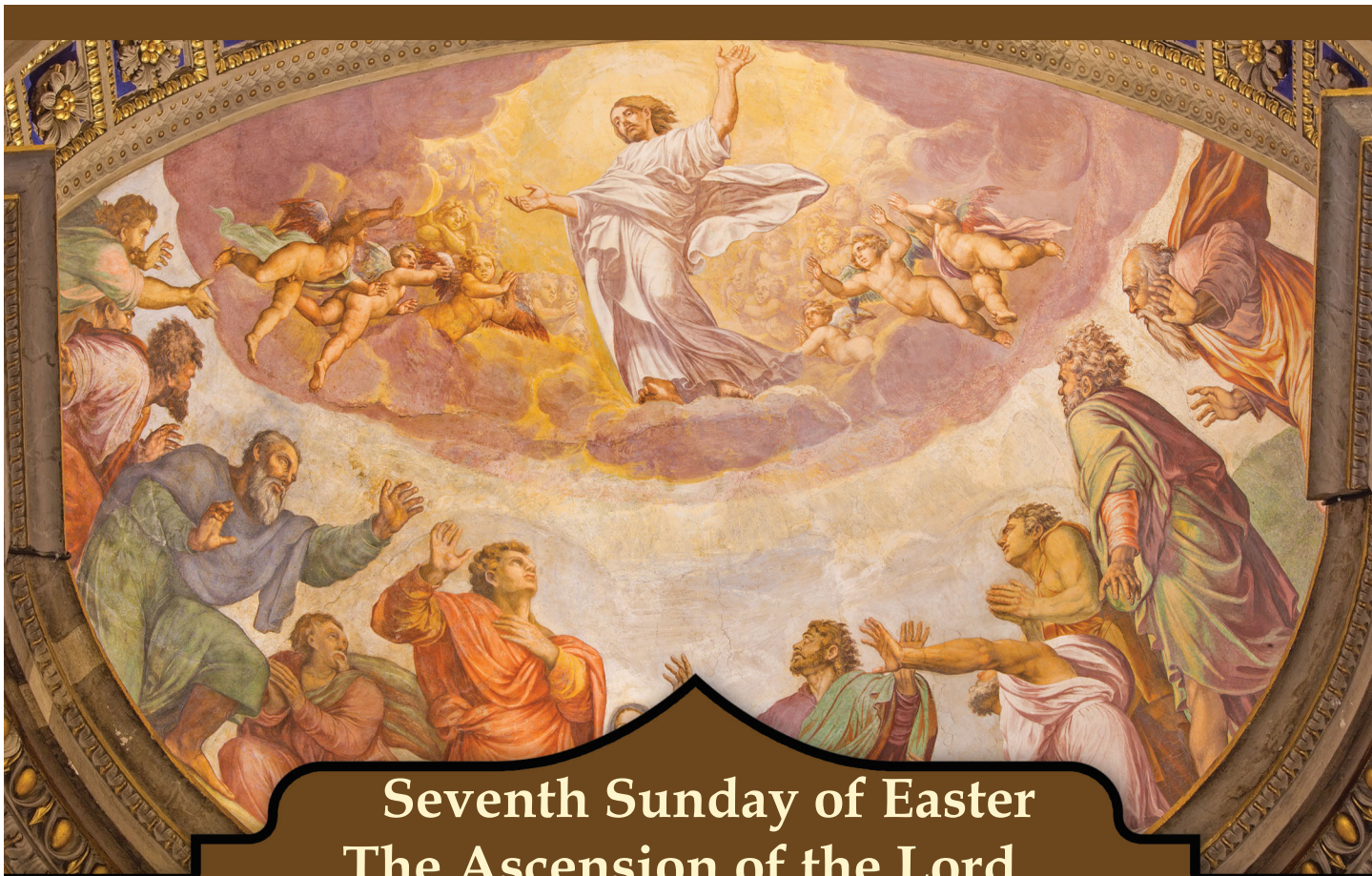

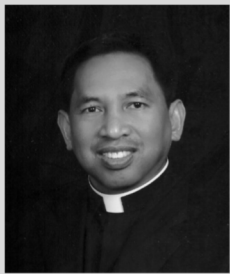

Happy Mother's Day! Let us remember and honor our earthly mothers, and of course our Heavenly mother Mary, this month. *If you are a mother or grandmother, you are deserving of blessing and honor for who you*

are and for all you do. May the good Lord bless you, our mothers, grandmothers, aunts, and Godmothers, with the finest of spiritual blessings today.

Do you know that the church is also a mother? We call her Holy Mother Church. The church is considered to be a mother to her members because she is the Bride of Christ, and all other churches have their origin or derived from her. The Church is our mother. So, we remember and honor our church too today.

Yes, the Church knows on this Mother's Day that she, too, is "mother of all," especially the vulnerable. In today's Gospel Jesus speaks about entrusting his glory to us. What an extraordinary gift to have received, similar to what St Paul refers to when he talks about us holding our treasure, Christ, in our earthenware jars, our bodies. In the second century St Irenaeus said, "The glory of God is humanity fully alive."

Recently I met Brian, a 52-year-old executive. He told me that 12 months ago he had a massive heart attack. "I was at a fundraising tennis day for my kid's parish school. I hadn't played for years. After a few tough games, I felt some pain in my chest and arms. Can you believe it? I ignored it and played on!" Brian lived in the fast lane. "I was ignoring my family, working very long hours, had too much stress, did very little exercise and ate badly. I was a disaster waiting to happen—and it did! My hour came, well almost. I collapsed at the net and needed to be resuscitated at the hospital. I'm the luckiest guy I know. And it's the best thing that ever happened to me."

As Brian recovered he had an important conversation with the hospital chaplain. "He said he had never met a person who, on their deathbed, said that they wished they'd spent more time at work. A light went on in my head. When I got better I got a different job, started to look after myself and enjoy my family. I go the gym with my children three times a week. Somehow I thought I was invincible and didn't have to care for myself. And now, though I might be a bit less well off financially, I am definitely happier. And so is my family."

How we look after our bodies is a good take on how seriously we believe that Jesus entrusts his glory not only to us, but also in us.

Over the centuries the church has not helped us have a good image about our bodies. By the fifth century Christians were convinced that the body and the soul were separate entities within us. The soul was pure and good. The body could lead us into sin. Until recently Christians were taught to hate their bodies and to purge them so as to let the spiritual win out over the physical. It was a long way from St Paul telling us to glorify God with our bodies because they're temples of the Holy Spirit!

And while we need to be careful that we don't become narcissists and end up worshipping our bodies, if we see them as the earthenware jars holding the Lord, then being committed to getting fit, and staying fit, is a way to show God's glory working in us. It also brings a balance into our lives, a pride in ourselves, and demonstrates that we understand that the spiritual life also involves how we spend our time and energy away from the Church as well.

May these final weeks of the Easter season enable us to make the best possible choices about where we put our bodies, and what we put into them, so that we might take up the challenge of St Irenaeus' words, "The Glory of God is humanity fully alive."

Lectio Divina

Read: Luke narrates the event of the ascension of the Lord. Mark informs us of the Lord's command to be his missionaries to the ends of the world. Paul invites us to embrace this vocation that coopts our many God-given gifts so as to complete God's dream of uniting the entire universe in the one body of Christ.

Reflect: To the disciples who stood looking wide-eyed at the sky to which Christ ascended—some believing, some rejoicing, and most of them confused—the angels throw a reprimand: "Men of Galilee, why do you stand here looking up at the sky?" Indeed they are not meant to be standing there looking up; they are meant to go out everywhere, to all the Galilees of the world, and get down to serious work that Jesus entrusted to them: preach the Good News of God's love and forgiveness, His redemption and grace, and thus build up the body of Christ. The reprimand continues today: As Pope Francis reminds us, we are not merely to be an adoring, cozy Church, but we are to be a serving Church that smells of the sheep on the margins and is bruised by its journey on the peripheries.

Pray: Pray for the missionaries serving in the margins of the world.

Act: Identify three practical ways you can be a missionary in the margins of the world
