YOUR HEALTH MATTERS! Eat more fiber! You've probably heard this before, but do you know why fiber is so good for your health? Dietary fiber- found mainly in oats, peas, beans, apples, citrus fruits, carrots, and barley is probably best known for its ability to prevent or relieve constipation. But foods containing fiber can provide other health benefits as well, such as helping to maintain a healthy weight and lowering your risk of diabetes and some forms of cancer, like colorectal cancer! The National fiber recommendation for men = 30-38 grams per day; women= 25 grams (ages 18-50); women = 21 grams (ages 51 plus). You can find the amount of fiber that your food contains by reading the labels on your packages. It is always best to start slowly when introducing more fiber to your diet and drink plenty of water and always check with your physician before you start any changes in your eating routine.

1 cup carrots = 3.6 grams of fiber
 Fruits = 3-4.0 grams of fiber; raspberries, blackberries = 7.6-8.0 grams of fiber
 Peas = 8.8 grams of fiber
 Artichokes = 10.3 grams of fiber per medium vegetable, cooked

Two spiritual formations are happening this Saturday. We have the Eucharistic Ministers formation in the morning and the Stewardship Formation in the afternoon. It will be a

long day for some who are attending both sessions. Don't you worry, you are spiritually blessed!

The Eucharistic Ministers are blessed indeed as they are given this great opportunity to be able to give the "Body of Christ" to the people. In effect, you are Christ's bearer, holding his body in his hand and offering Christ to the communicant. What a great privilege!

At the mass the priest, acting in the person of Christ, says: "This is my body which will be given up for you." I realize that something like this happens in a Christian marriage. Each spouse says to the other, "This is my body, to be given up for you." As a married couple, they in turn, say to the Lord, "this is our body to be given up for you." A good steward always says to the Lord, "this is my body to be given up for you." Have you?

The priests in the Archdiocese of San Francisco will be having our 2019 Priests' Convocation at Asilomar, Pacific Grove this Monday, September 30th to Thursday, October 3rd. The theme for our gathering is "Getting Better Together: A Path to Organizational Health." We have invited experts from the Evangelium Consulting Group to help us understand and work towards greater unity and well-being with our presbyterate. Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a process for unbaptized adults who are interested in becoming Catholic and for baptized Christians who seek full communion with the Catholic Church through the Sacraments of the Holy Eucharist and Confirmation. Sessions are held every Thursday, at 7:00-8:30 PM in the Pastoral Center (1555 39th Avenue). Please Sr. Cristina in the parish office to register.

Youth Mass and Ministry is held every third Saturday of the month at 5:00 PM. Young people who have been prepared by Sr. Cristina for liturgical ministries, as Lectors or Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, participate actively at Mass together with adult parishioners. We also have a Youth Choir and assigned ushers, guided by respective adult ushers. The Mass is followed by socialization and social action in the Pastoral Center until 8:00 PM. Our next gathering will be on Saturday, October 19th. Our resource speaker is Mr. Michael Gotuaco of the Archdiocesan Missionary Children Association (Holy Childhood), who will motivate us during this missionary month of October to be generous in helping children in developing countries. Brother Gerry Vasquez (seminarian in his Pastoral Year here at Holy Name) will also talk about an evangelization project in our neighborhood, that can be done by our young people.
