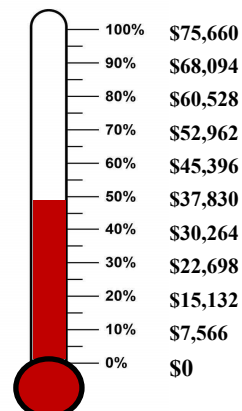

## Pastor's Column

**Remembering Our Beloved** – An anonymous person wrote *"Those we love don't go away; they walk beside us every day. Unseen, unheard, but always near, still loved, still missed and very dear."*

These words echo our faith and what Jesus showed us on the cross, that love is stronger than death. We may not be able to stop death, but the love of God conquers death for us and raises us to new life. And their love for us will not disappear, but in heaven it will become even more pure. Every year during the month of November, we continue to remember our loved ones. Starting from All Souls' Day (November 2<sup>nd</sup>) we will have a Novena of masses for our loved ones. I invite you to submit the names of deceased family members and friends using the All Souls' envelopes included with your donation envelopes, at the entrances of the church, or by emailing us their names, or by calling the parish office and leaving them with Colleen, our parish secretary. We will remember them in a special way from Nov 2 – 11, with the last day, remembering all our Veterans. The parish will also have a special mass of remembrance for those who have died within the last year at our parish, on Saturday, November 14 at the 9am mass. If you'd like to add someone who died outside of our parish, please contact Sr. Cristina to let her know, as we will read their names aloud at the prayers of the faithful.

Under normal circumstances, the faithful can obtain a *Plenary Indulgence* that can be applied to a deceased person, from Nov 1 – 8 when they visit the cemetery or offer prayers or other acts of charity. This year, due to the coronavirus and the need to avoid large crowds forming, the Pope has granted an expanded way to obtain this indulgence. This year, the faithful can obtain the indulgence by either visiting a cemetery, *even if only mentally*, on any day in November and devoutly praying for the faithful departed. A Plenary Indulgence is like a complete pardon of our "temporal punishment." Even though God forgives us of our sins, when we confess them, but we still live with the effects of our sinful actions, the "temporal punishment." So when we pray for a beloved who has died, or offer our good works, these can be joined with the sacrifice of Christ, to be offered to our beloved deceased to wipe away their temporal punishment.

In the Decree issued by Pope Francis (Oct 22, 2020), it reminds us that the typical way to obtain the *Plenary Indulgence* still applies. We should: (in light of the pandemic, at the earliest opportunity):

Be "completely detached from sin," by celebrating the Sacrament of Confession

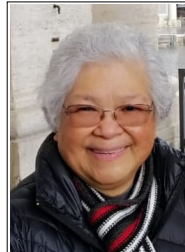
Receive Holy Communion

Pray for the Holy Father's intention

And offer prayers for our beloved such as the Rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, meditating on various gospel passages or by completing a work of mercy by offering to God the suffering and discomforts of our own life.

In so doing, we remain connected with our beloved deceased through our prayers for them and through their prayers for us. Another anonymous poet wrote, *"I will hold you in my heart until I can hold you again in heaven,"* but with faith, we can also hold them through our prayers.

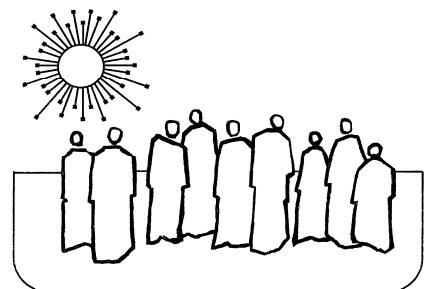

## Informed Consent for In-Person Attendance at Mass During COVID-19 Public Health Crisis

Holy Name Parish intends as best it can to follow all mandated Archdiocesan safety protocols and county regulations for public worship services. However, the county medical officer has advised us that public gatherings may nevertheless present an increased possibility of contagion even if safety precautions are taken, and therefore he has asked us to inform you that your participation may increase the risk for yourself and your family.

**In particular, if you are over the age of 50 or have a chronic or underlying medical condition, a gathering increases your risk of contracting the virus or if you do contract the virus it may have a greater chance of creating serious illness that could even result in death. If you fall into this high-risk category and/or if you feel sick, are displaying COVID-19 symptoms (especially fever, cough or difficulty breathing) or if any of these symptoms are being experienced by someone in your household, you should stay home. The church cannot guarantee that there is no risk of infection for attendees.**

Your signature below indicates that you understand these risks and agree to abide by all safety protocols and to follow all other instructions that may be given, and that you acknowledge the risks involved. This information will be kept confidential to the extent the law allows and is protected from law enforcement and immigration authorities. Should you desire to share the mass time and date, it will help with contact tracing should the need arise.

Furthermore, you are acknowledging that you have answered NO to all the questions below. If you answered yes to any of these questions, please do not enter the church and we recommend you to isolate or go home and contact your health provider.

1. In the last 10 days, have you been diagnosed with COVID-19 or had a test confirming you have the virus?

2. In the past 14 days, have you had "Close Contact" with someone who was diagnosed with COVID-19 or had a test confirming they have the virus while they were contagious?

† "Close Contact" means you had any of the following types of contact with the person with COVID-19 while they were contagious<sup>‡</sup>:

- Lived or stayed overnight with them
- Stayed within 6 feet of them for more than 15 minutes
- Was their intimate sex partner
- Exposed to direct contact with their body fluids or secretions (e.g., they coughed or sneezed on you) while you were not wearing a face mask, gown, and gloves
- Took care of them or they took care of you

‡ Contagiousness: People with COVID-19 are considered contagious starting 48 hours before their symptoms began until 1) they haven't had a fever for at least 24 hours, 2) their symptoms have improved, AND 3) at least 10 days have passed since their symptoms began. If the person with COVID-19 never had symptoms, then they are considered contagious starting 48 hours before their test that confirmed they have COVID-19 until 10 days after the date of that test.

3. Have you had one or more of these symptoms today or within the past 24 hours which is new or not explained by another condition?

- Fever (100.4°F/38.0°C or greater), chills, repeated shaking/shivering
- Loss of taste or smell
- Cough
- Muscle or body aches
- Sore throat
- Headache
- Shortness of breath, difficulty breathing
- Runny or congested nose
- Feeling unusually weak or fatigued
- Diarrhea
- Nausea or vomiting
