Pastor's Column

Being People of Hope – I am writing this column on the eve of Election Day. How the Election will turn out, I do not yet know. But going into it, I hear about anxiety, about lawsuits, about the possibility of violence. Some people view Trump or Biden supporters with mistrust, suspicion and even outright hostility. They've thrown accusations at each other, they've thrown eggs and a few times they've even thrown fists at each other. And Christians don't seem to be behaving any better. Some priests have even preached the evil of voting for the other candidate and for that they should be excommunicated. What's a Catholic to do?

Jesus spoke about being the yeast that makes the whole dough rise. Jesus spoke of peacemakers as children of God. Pope Francis, quoting St. Francis, reminds us to be *Fratelli Tutti*, brothers and sisters to one another. We have more in common than what divides us. First of all, we're all Americans, and we want what's good for our nation. We may disagree on what that may look like, but we should always give each other the benefit of the doubt, that we care for the well-being of our country. We are also Catholic Christians. And we realize that no political party fully represents the vision of God's Kingdom. Each has bits and pieces of it, and so one party may advance certain values of God's Kingdom while another party may advance others. Jesus taught us that the Kingdom is present, but it won't reach its fullness until He returns. In the meanwhile, we are to do our part. And doing our part also means that we don't hate each other, or the other's politics. If Jesus teaches us to love our enemies, we can certainly love a brother, or sister of a different political party or ideology who is also a fellow American. As Pope Francis would emphasize, they are *Fratelli Tutti*.

Lastly, Pope Francis encourages us to develop a culture or a habit of "encounter." He encourages us to meet the other and like the Native American proverb, *"to understand the other, by walking a mile in the other's moccasins."* There's richness in meeting and encountering the other: to listen, observe and understand the other. Travel Guide, Rick Steves, says that *"Travel is rich with learning opportunities, and the ultimate souvenir is a broader perspective."* So do not be quick to judge or to look down on others. As St. Paul taught the Romans, *"16 Have the same regard for one another; do not be haughty... do not be wise in your own estimation. 17 Do not repay anyone evil for evil; be concerned for what is noble in the sight of all... live at peace with all. 19 Beloved, do not look for revenge... for it is written, 'Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord.' 20 Rather, 'if your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him something to drink; for by so doing you will heap burning coals upon his head.' 21 Do not be conquered by evil but conquer evil with good."* (Romans 12:16-21). In so doing, we help build God's Kingdom on earth. Political parties will come and go. What will remain for eternity, is the Kingdom of God that we can help build.

COVID TESTING AT HOLY NAME

Holy Name will be hosting a Covid Testing Day on **Thursday, November 12th from 9am to 4pm** in the school gym.

Families must register and schedule a time using the link below.

Covid swab and antibody test will be available.

Please arrive no more than 10 minutes before your testing time and have all forms completed before you arrive.

Participants should park in the white zones on Lawton Street between 39th and 40th Avenues. You should then walk into the Gym/Ryan Hall via the Entrance on Lawton. Please practice social distancing and sign-in at the entrance.

1. Patient Test Request Form
2. A photocopy of the front and back of their medical insurance card.
If without insurance, must provide a photocopy of their government issued photo ID (driver license, state ID card, etc.)
3. Venous Consent Form (if doing the antibody test)
4. Authorization Form to Disclose Results (optional).

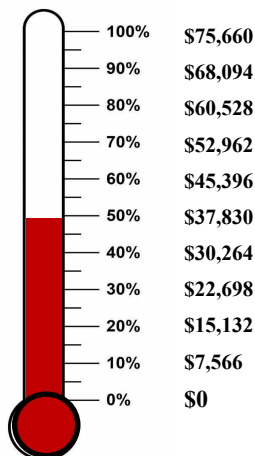
VETERAN'S DAY HOLIDAY

EXPECTING THE UNEXPECTED

If it ever crossed your mind that Jesus was somewhat lacking in a sense of humor, today's Gospel should belie any such notion. Jesus' story of the five wise and five foolish bridesmaids is downright hilarious. The circumstances of the story were surely familiar to Jesus' listeners, just as they are—if we think about it—to us. Weddings never, ever start on time. There's always a delay. Buttons pop off at the last minute. Flowers wilt. Cars full of wedding guests get caught in traffic. Soloists contract laryngitis. Brides or grooms or priests show up late! So the only reasonable way to approach a wedding is with a sense of humor, to realize that something probably will go awry, and, when that happens, to smile about it.

Jesus tells this funny story to encourage us to be watchful, yes; to be ready, yes. But he doesn't tell it to make us dour and somber. The heavy-hearted tremble, waver, lose sight of their place and purpose, and fall asleep. The lighthearted know that the unexpected will happen—is bound to happen—so they are awake in their place and ready in their purpose when it comes.

Informed Consent for In-Person Attendance at Mass During COVID-19 Public Health Crisis

Holy Name Parish intends as best it can to follow all mandated Archdiocesan safety protocols and county regulations for public worship services. However, the county medical officer has advised us that public gatherings may nevertheless present an increased possibility of contagion even if safety precautions are taken, and therefore he has asked us to inform you that your participation may increase the risk for yourself and your family.

In particular, if you are over the age of 50 or have a chronic or underlying medical condition, a gathering increases your risk of contracting the virus or if you do contract the virus it may have a greater chance of creating serious illness that could even result in death. If you fall into this high-risk category and/or if you feel sick, are displaying COVID-19 symptoms (especially fever, cough or difficulty breathing) or if any of these symptoms are being experienced by someone in your household, you should stay home. The church cannot guarantee that there is no risk of infection for attendees.

Your signature below indicates that you understand these risks and agree to abide by all safety protocols and to follow all other instructions that may be given, and that you acknowledge the risks involved. This information will be kept confidential to the extent the law allows and is protected from law enforcement and immigration authorities. Should you desire to share the mass time and date, it will help with contact tracing should the need arise.

Furthermore, you are acknowledging that you have answered NO to all the questions below. If you answered yes to any of these questions, please do not enter the church and we recommend you to isolate or go home and contact your health provider.

1. In the last 10 days, have you been diagnosed with COVID-19 or had a test confirming you have the virus?

2. In the past 14 days, have you had "Close Contact" with someone who was diagnosed with COVID-19 or had a test confirming they have the virus while they were contagious?

† "Close Contact" means you had any of the following types of contact with the person with COVID-19 while they were contagious[‡]:

- Lived or stayed overnight with them
- Stayed within 6 feet of them for more than 15 minutes
- Was their intimate sex partner
- Exposed to direct contact with their body fluids or secretions (e.g., they coughed or sneezed on you) while you were not wearing a face mask, gown, and gloves
- Took care of them or they took care of you

‡ Contagiousness: People with COVID-19 are considered contagious starting 48 hours before their symptoms began until 1) they haven't had a fever for at least 24 hours, 2) their symptoms have improved, AND 3) at least 10 days have passed since their symptoms began. If the person with COVID-19 never had symptoms, then they are considered contagious starting 48 hours before their test that confirmed they have COVID-19 until 10 days after the date of that test.

3. Have you had one or more of these symptoms today or within the past 24 hours which is new or not explained by another condition?

- Fever (100.4°F/38.0°C or greater), chills, repeated shaking/shivering
- Loss of taste or smell
- Cough
- Muscle or body aches
- Sore throat
- Headache
- Shortness of breath, difficulty breathing
- Runny or congested nose
- Feeling unusually weak or fatigued
- Diarrhea
- Nausea or vomiting
